



Ethics for Preceptors

Activity Description:

As pharmacy becomes increasingly central in health care practice and delivery, the professional pharmacist will require ethical sophistication to cope with these expanded responsibilities. This is doubly true for pharmacists who serve as preceptors and ethical role models for students. The goal of this application-based activity is to provide pharmacist preceptors with an understanding of the theoretical basis of ethical decisions, tools to apply to ethical problems in practice, and teaching strategies to engage students in critical reflection about ethical issues.

Learning Objectives:

Upon successful completion of this activity, *pharmacist preceptors* should be able to:

1. Given a practice-related issue, discern if an ethical problem is present.
2. Define and apply the following principles to clinical practice issues: respect for autonomy, beneficence, nonmaleficence, justice and fidelity.
3. Given an ethical problem, propose a justifiable resolution.
4. Describe methods to model and encourage sound ethical decision making in clinical practice.
